# Background

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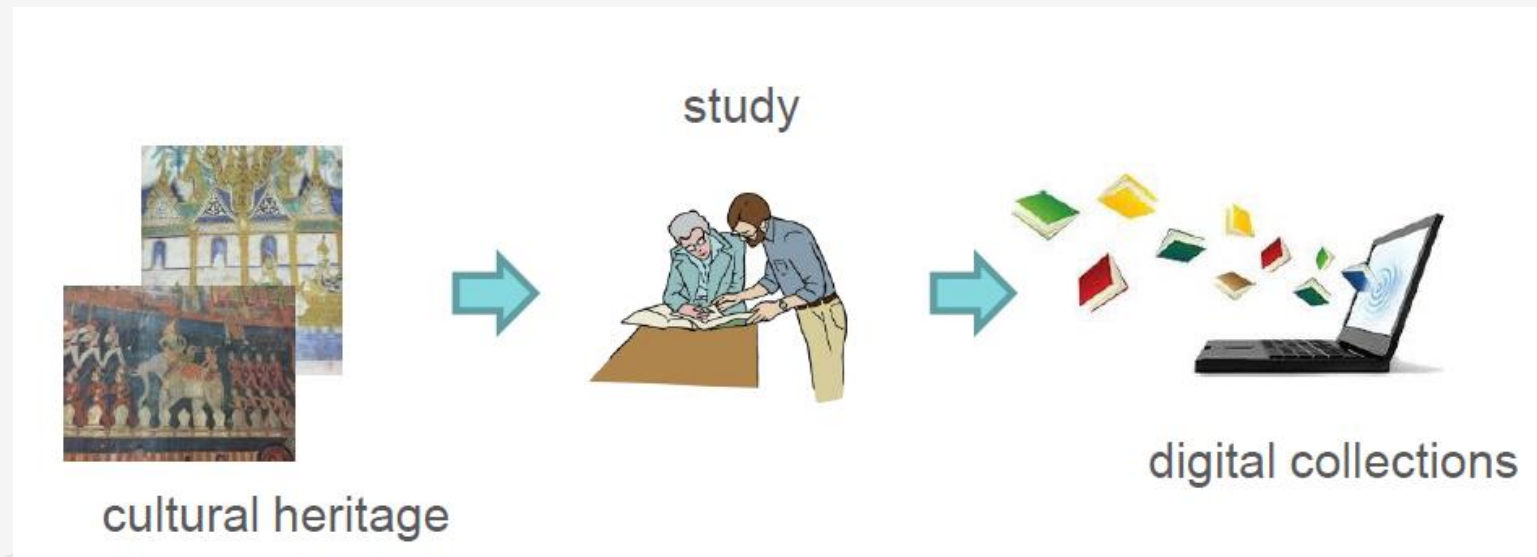
Many murals are poor condition and invisible.



# Background

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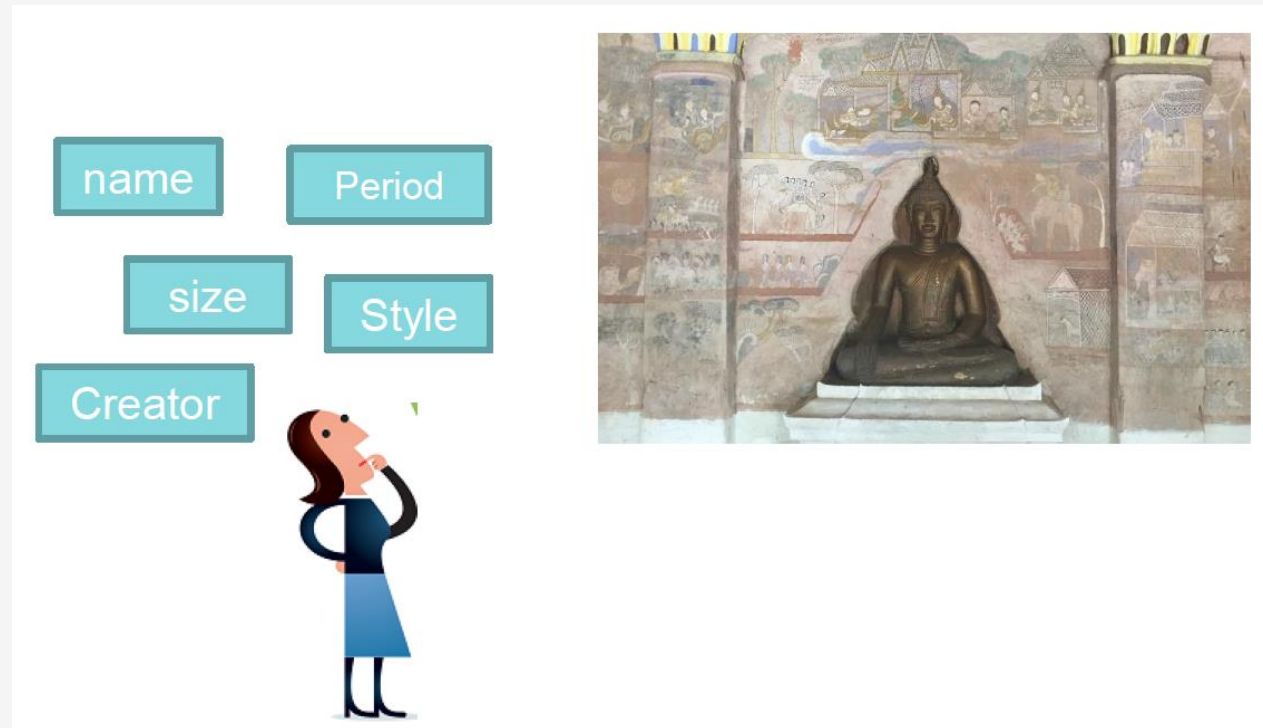
Cultural Heritage Information Management (CHIM) and Digital Humanities is a research issue emerged from integration between computer science and humanities.

- 2 To study the need to search and access data murals of users.

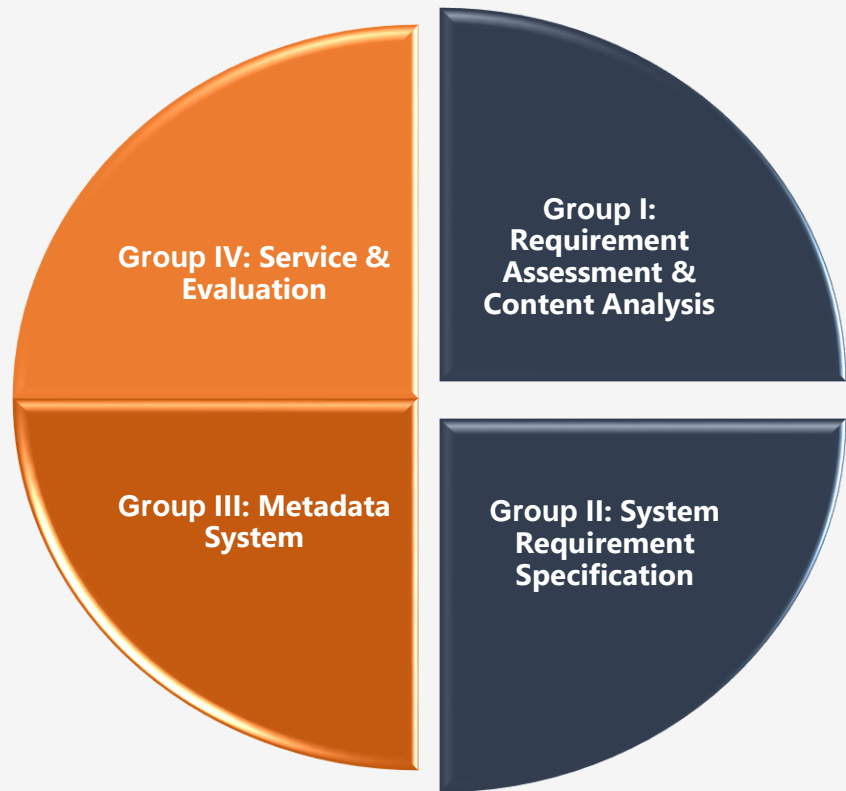

## **Group I: Requirement Assessment & Content Analysis**

1. The study and analysis of the physical characteristics and content of knowledge appearing in murals painting from the temple in the Northeastern.
2. The User studies need information about murals.

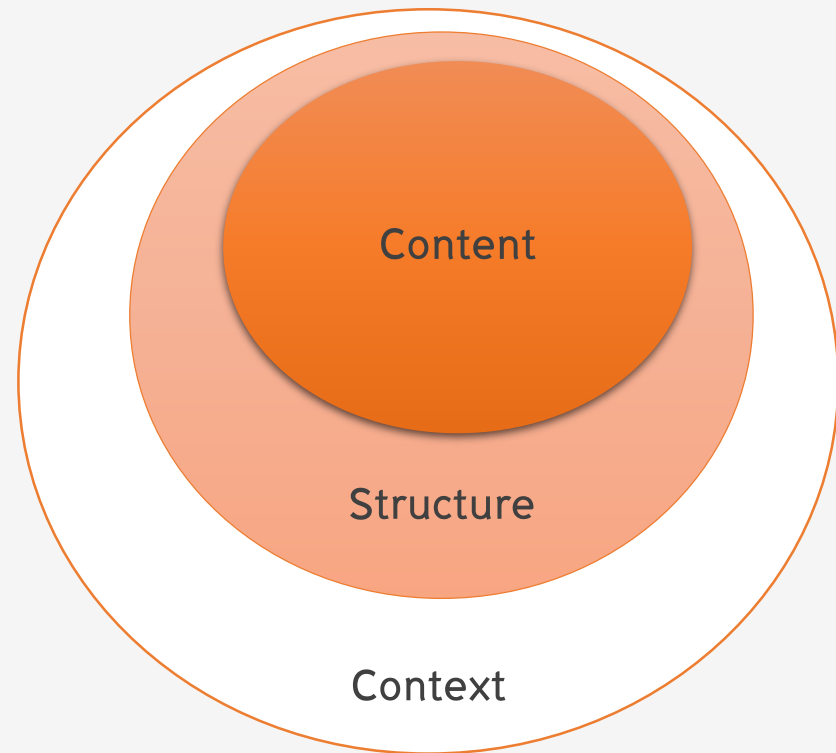
## **Group II: System Requirement Specification**

# Literature Review

Features of information (Baca & Getty Research Institute., 2008)



## **Content**

Basic information that describes the meaning of a document, such as how it is created, preservation, place found.

## **Context**

Information related to the external appearance and management of the content of resources, such as location, size, etc. (Extrinsic)

## **Structure**

Story recorded in the resource (Intrinsic)

# Literature Review

The VRA Core is a data standard for the description of works of visual culture as well as the images that document them.

- It outlines metadata for describing visual arts. that can present descriptive information about works and pictures
- Standardization with flexibility to implement
- The VRA Core stereotype can enable the sharing of records that depict the original artwork and photographs.
- It can be represented as XML, allowing data to be encoded for use and transfer through various software, and to share files as XML.

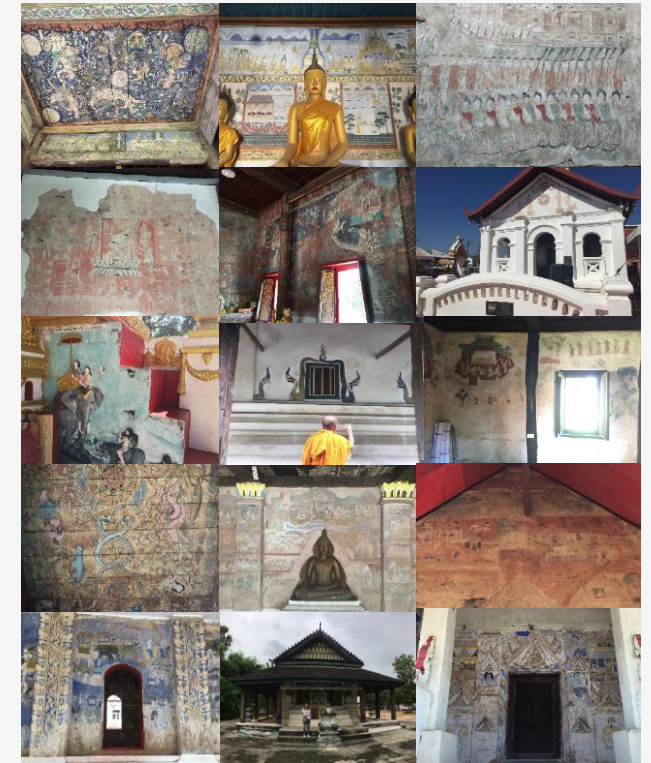

## Results according to objective 2 : The study the behavior of information on murals users.

StylePeriod	A defined style, historical period, group, school, dynasty, movement, etc.

Technique	The production or manufacturing processes, techniques, and methods incorporated in the fabrication or alteration of the work or image.
Textref	Contains the name of a related textual reference and any type of unique identifier that text assigns to a Work or Collection that is independent of any repository.
Title	The title or identifying phrase given to a Work or an Image.
Worktype	Identifies the specific type of WORK, COLLECTION, or IMAGE being described in the record.
Conserve	Restoration information from individuals or corporation.
Position	Identification of buildings found murals.
Structure	An overview of the mural paintings to illustrate all the elements found in the murals.
Type	Explanations about the types and characteristics of murals.
Sequencing	Description of the sequence of the painting
Date time	Information on the date and time of recording data into the system.

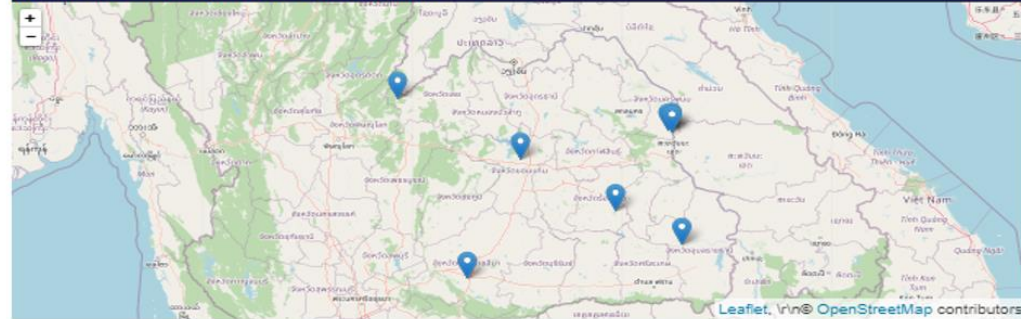
